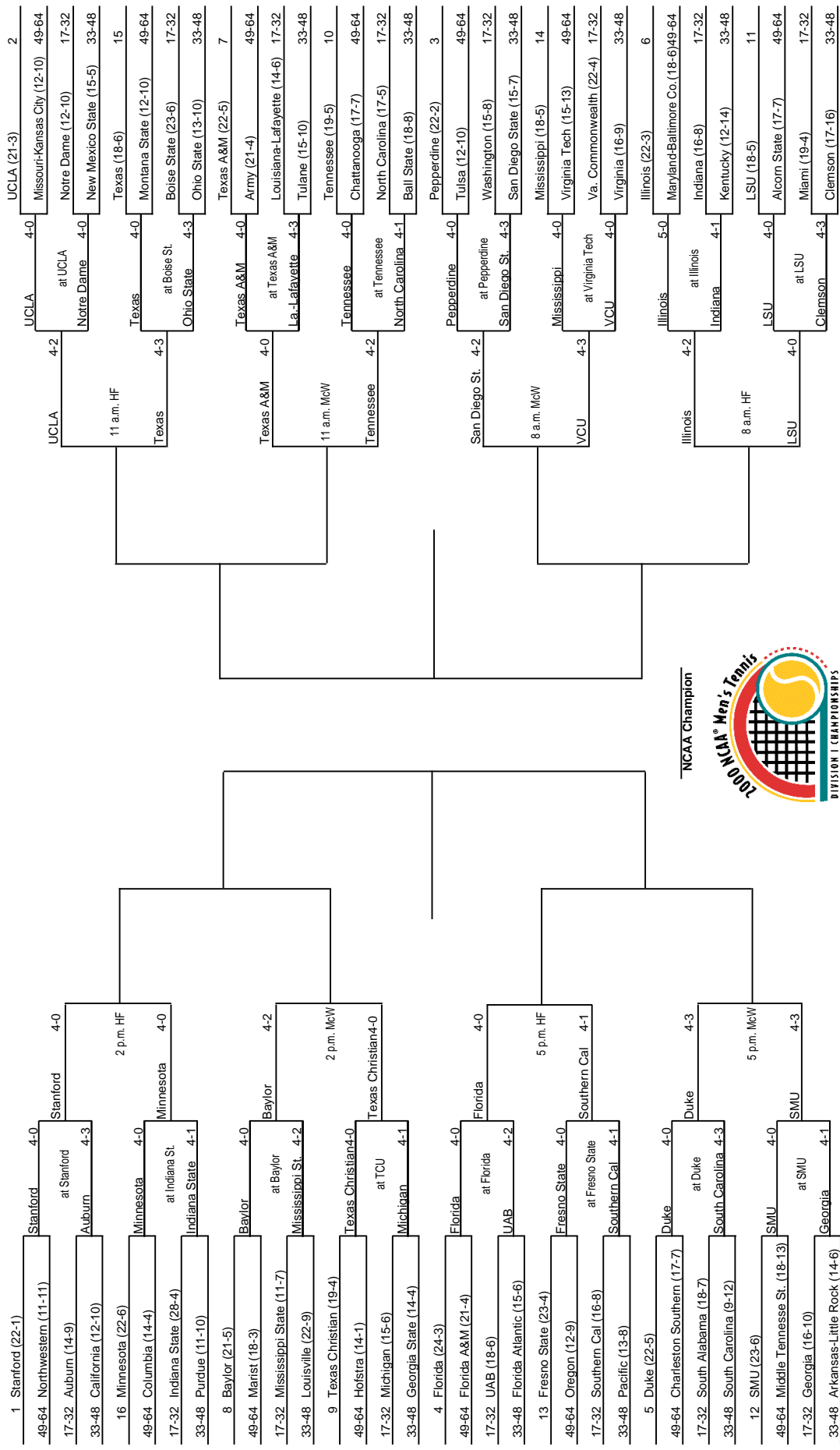

AZTECS IN ATHENS

- ★ The San Diego State men's tennis team, under the direction of seventh-year head coach John Nelson, will be making its first-ever appearance in the Sweet 16 when the Aztec travel to Athens, Ga., for the 2000 NCAA Men's Tennis Championships, May 20-28.
- ★ SDSU (17-7), currently ranked No. 31 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA), will do battle with 19th-ranked Virginia Commonwealth (24-4) in the third round at 8 a.m. (EDT) Saturday. Should the Aztecs advance, they would meet the winner of No. 10 LSU (20-5) versus No. 4 Illinois (24-3) in Sunday's quarterfinals.
- ★ Saturday's meeting between VCU and SDSU will be the first between the two schools. San Diego State has also never face LSU. The Aztecs are 0-1 versus Illinois.



THE ROAD TO ATHENS

- ★ San Diego State earned its trip to the round of 16 with victories over No. 30 Washington, 4-3, and No. 8 Pepperdine, 4-2, in regional play at Malibu, Calif.
- ★ Freshman Oliver Maiberger ran his singles winning streak to 20 with a come-from-behind win at No. 2 singles to lift SDSU to a 4-3 win over No. 30 Washington (15-9) in the first round. The Huskies captured the doubles point and jumped out to an early 1-0 lead before the Aztecs came roaring back in singles, taking four of the six positions to secure the win. The victory marked the second straight year that SDSU advanced to a regional final. It was the first time this season, however, that SDSU had come back to win a dual match after losing the doubles point.
- ★ Freshman Valentino Pest posted a come-from-behind win over Sebastien Graeff at No. 3 singles to lift San Diego State to a 4-2 upset over No. 8 Pepperdine in the second round. The Aztecs opened the regional final by taking the doubles point, 2-1, behind wins in the No. 1 and 2 positions. Pepperdine (24-3) picked up wins at the No. 5 and 6 singles spots but were never able to take the lead as SDSU continued its season-long roll at the top of the lineup with wins at No. 1, 2 and 3.

ANOTHER WINNING CAMPAIGN

- ★ With their wins at Pepperdine over the weekend, the Aztecs assured themselves of a second straight top-35 finish. SDSU, which slipped from 26th to 31st in the May 10 Intercollegiate Tennis Association team rankings after falling in the MWC Tournament final, posted a 15-6 record in a year ago and were ranked No. 35 in the final ITA poll.
- ★ The 2000 season marks SDSU's third consecutive 15-win campaign. The Aztecs' 17 wins are the most ever by a John Nelson-coached SDSU squad and the most at the school since the team went 18-4 in 1993.

AZTECS HOT DOWN THE STRETCH

- ★ No team, at least in the West, was hotter over the final six weeks of the year than the Aztecs.
- ★ San Diego State heads to Athens with wins in 11 of its last 12 contests and 14-of-16 dating to March 3.
- ★ The Aztecs won eight in a row to close out the regular season and were in the midst of a nine-match winning streak before being upset by New Mexico in the Mountain West Conference Tournament final in Albuquerque, N.M.
- ★ Seven of SDSU's 17 wins this year have come via shutout.

MWC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- ★ San Diego State, which entered the inaugural MWC Men's Tennis Championship as the top seed, had a somewhat disappointing showing, placing second after suffering a 4-1 upset by New Mexico in the final.
- ★ After first-round bye and the Aztecs easily got past BYU, 4-1, to reach the championship match.

SDSU IN THE ITA RANKINGS

- ★ If you're wondering San Diego State hasn't popped up on many radars until this week you need not look any farther than the March 8 ITA poll when SDSU was not ranked. The Aztecs, who were ranked No. 37 in the preseason, were without the services of its top three players to open the season and got off to a slow start, dropping them out of the poll. A March 6 victory over Baylor, however, catapulted SDSU all the way to No. 27. The Aztecs have won 14-of-16 since a March 1 loss to Michigan and have been ranked in the No. 24-31 range.

INDIVIDUALLY-RANKED AZTECS

★ San Diego State has two players ranked on the ITA singles chart and one ranked team in doubles. Senior Alex Waske (14-1) is currently ranked No. 37 in singles while freshman Oliver Maiberger (24-1) is No. 73. In doubles Waske and partner Adam Webster (8-2) hold down the No. 37 spot.

DOMINATION AT THE TOP

★ If there is one area that SDSU has dominated this season it's been the top of the singles lineup. Heading into the NCAA Championships, the Aztecs are a combined 37-7 at the No. 1 and 2 singles positions.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND

★ In addition to SDSU's team berth in this year's NCAA Tournament, senior Alex Waske and freshman Oliver Maiberger both earned bids to the 2000 NCAA Individual Championships. Both will remain in Athens, Ga., following the team championship for the singles tournament, May 24-26.

SUPER SENIOR

- ★ Senior Alex Waske is currently ranked No. 37 and enters NCAA Championships with a 14-1 record, all in SDSU's No. 1 spot. His only loss was to New Mexico's Matt Amgwerd, a match he was forced to retire from after suffering an ankle injury.
- ★ An All-Mountain West Conference selection in both singles and doubles in 2000, Waske was also chosen by the league's coaches as the Player of the Year. As if that wasn't enough, Waske was recently tabbed as the Region VII ITA Senior Player of the Year, making him eligible for the ITA's National Senior Player-of-the-Year award.
- ★ Waske also picked up a pair of Player-of-the-Week awards this season from the Mountain West Conference.

FANTASTIC FROSH

- ★ Freshman Oliver Maiberger heads into the postseason on a roll. Currently the ITA's 73rd-ranked player, Maiberger posted a 24-1 record in 2000, including a perfect 23-0 mark in dual-match play. He is currently riding a 21-match winning streak.
- ★ An All-Mountain West Conference honoree in singles, Maiberger is also the MWC's Freshman of the Year.
- ★ Maiberger was twice selected as the MWC's Player of the Week.

STREAKING WITH HASSON

- ★ Sophomore Travis Hasson, finished the regular season 16-4 in dual match play. He entered the postseason with victories in 14 of his last 16 matches before dropping both contests during regional action.

BREAKING THE 20-WIN PLATEAU

- ★ The Aztecs have two 20-match winners in 2000. Freshman Oliver Maiberger leads the way with a 24-1 overall record while sophomore Travis Hasson owns a 21-10 mark on the season.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- ★ SDSU used 22 different doubles combinations during the 1999-00 campaign, including 21 separate teams in dual match play.
- ★ SDSU won the doubles point in 14 of 22 matches, including nine of its last 10 duals and 12 of its last 14 to end the regular season.
- ★ Maiberger and Hasson led the way in the victory column, posting a 9-2 overall record, including 3-1 at No. 1 and 6-1 at No. 1.
- ★ Waske and Webster were nearly as good, going 8-2 on the season in SDSU's top spot.

IN THE CLASSROOM

- ★ Going into spring action, the men's tennis team recorded the highest GPA of all sports at SDSU. Alex Waske and Travis Hasson are 2000 GTE Academic Award Nominees and boast GPAs of 3.29 and 3.51, respectively.

JOHN NELSON, HEAD COACH

SEVENTH SEASON AT SDSU • RECORD AT SDSU: 81-77 • CAREER RECORD: 260-140

John Nelson has done it again. Seven years after raising UC Davis to the pinnacle of Division II tennis, Nelson's formula for success has again paid dividends — this time lifting San Diego State to its first-ever Sweet 16 appearance in 64 years of collegiate tennis.

Nelson came to SDSU at the end of the 1993 season after spending the previous five years as head coach at UC Davis where he led the Aggies to 90-25 record (.783) and the 1992 NCAA Division II National Championship.

The 1997 Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Region VII Coach of the Year, Nelson has compiled an 81-77 mark at SDSU, including a 32-13 record over the last two seasons.

In 1999, Nelson led the Aztecs to their first regional final and a 15-6 record, earning him the honor of U.S. Tennis Association San Diego Pro/Coach of the Year for 1999.

One of college tennis' top fundraisers, Nelson has also show an acumen for developing top talent, coaching current Aztec Alex Waske to a top-300 world ranking, teammate Oliver Maiberger to a top-100 national collegiate ranking and women's tennis player Ginger Helgeson to a top-30 world ranking.

In his little spare time, Nelson enjoys studying the martial art of Jujitsu. A third degree black belt who has been practicing the art form since the age of 12, Nelson has incorporated Jujitsu into the Aztecs' training regimen and sets aside time each week for the

team to work on the martial art.

Prior to his arrival on Montezuma Mesa, Nelson was selected as the 1992 Division II National Coach of the Year. A seven-time Northern California Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Nelson also produced five NCAA singles finalists and 21 players who qualified for national individual championships, including two singles and three doubles national champions.

Nelson got his coaching start as men's tennis coach at CSU Hayward from 1983-88. He also served as the head tennis professional at the Santa Clara Tennis Center from 1987-88.

Nelson is currently serving his third year on the Board of Directors for Intercollegiate Tennis Association, where he is a member of the ITA Regional Ranking Committee.

A 1978 graduate of CSU Hayward with a degree in physical education, Nelson earned a Master of Arts in education from Stanford University in 1979.

GENE CARSWELL, ASST. COACH

Gene Carswell is in his second season with the San Diego State men's tennis program. He is a San Diego native who possesses both collegiate and professional tennis experience.

Carswell attended Mt. Carmel High School and was a member of the Sun Devils 1989 CIF Championship tennis team. He then went on to the University of New Mexico where he was named the 1990 Rookie of the Year for the Lobos. A three-time All-Western Athletic Conference selection, Carswell helped lead New Mexico to three NCAA Tournament appearances. Individually, Carswell participated in the NCAA in both singles (1993) and doubles (1992 & '93).

Following college, Carswell played on the professional circuit

for four years, achieving a top-400 ATP singles ranking as well as a top-200 double ranking.

Prior to accepting his current position at SDSU, Carswell coached the boys tennis team at Poway High School in 1997 and '98, leading the Titans to the '98 CIF finals.

Carswell is married to the former Lainie Spence. The couple resides in La Jolla.

ALEX WASKE

1999-00: The Mountain West Conference and ITA Region VII Player of the Year...Also an All-MWC choice in singles and doubles...Enters the NCAA Championships with a 14-1 record after defeating Washington's Matt Hanlin and Pepperdine's No. 28-ranked Robert Kendrick in straight sets during regional play...Only loss on the season was a second-set default against New Mexico's Matt Amgerd due to an ankle injury...Enters the NCAA Championships ranked No. 37 on the ITA single charts...Is also ranked No. 37 in doubles with partner Adam Webster...Received his highest ranking of the year in April when he was No. 31 in the country...Is currently ranked No. 290 in the world...Earned two Mountain West Conference Player of the Week awards...Defeated Damien Ward of Brigham Young 6-2, 2-6, 6-2 at the MWC Championship...His win helped the Aztecs advance to league final...Played

consistently throughout the regular season in the No. 1 position...Biggest win of the year was a three-set victory over then 14th-ranked Johann Jooste of Baylor...Also knocked off No. 42 Peter Luczak of Fresno State in straight sets...All but two of his matches were won in straight sets...Teamed with three different partners in doubles, playing the most with Webster in SDSU's No. 1 position...The duo improved to 8-2 at No. 1 on the season after knocking off Quatrochi and Strasberg of Washington as well as Pepperdine's No. 7-ranked tandem of Graeff and Ross during regional action...The pair also defeated Baylor's then 38th-ranked Jooste/Gajdzik during the regular season...Compiled a 13-2 overall doubles record on the year...Also excels in the classroom with a 3.29 GPA and is a GTE Scholar-Athlete Candidate.
